Students should work with a Tiffin University advisor to identify a (minor or a second major/etc.). A Tiffin University advisor can also assist students with developing a graduation plan for full- or part-time study. A grade of “C” or better, or a “Pass” in a Pass/Fail transcribed course must be achieved to receive transfer credit.

All students must complete:

- A minimum of 121 semester hours (combination of courses at community college and TU) completed.
- A minimum of 48 semester hours completed at a 4-year institution with 30 of these semester hours being completed with Tiffin University.
