Students should complete the following mathematics course as part of the AA degree prior to transferring: **MATH (1470)**

Benefits:

- Students can select the frequency of their courses and the delivery method at Tiffin as there are multiple options from which to choose.
- Students can complete additional coursework past the Associate of Arts at Tri-C to make it more cost effective. This additional coursework may not be eligible for financial assistance, please check with Counselor and/or Financial Aid for more information.

All students must complete:

- A minimum of **(121)** semester credits (combined Tri-C and Tiffin University)
- Meet requirements **(48)** credits at a 4-year institution and 30 credit hours must be completed with Tiffin University
