MASTERS OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (MBA) :

ECO524 - Managerial Economics

1. Apply basic principles of Economics to Managerial decision-making.
2. Utilize basic models of Economics to analyze and predict market outcomes when there are changes in the economic environment.
3. Describe how real-world pricing schemes may increase firm's profits by distinguishing between high and low-value customers and setting a higher price for the high-value customers.
4. Analyze managerial decisions in which uncertainty is present.
5. Identify situations in which Adverse Selection or Moral Hazard may exist and develop strategies to eliminate those problems.
6. Determine whether employees', divisions', or external organizations' incentives align with the goals of the firm, and offer strategies for aligning others' incentives with the firm's goals.

FIN612 - Managerial Finance

1. Identify the various markets and potential capital-raising resources available to corporations and the risks and rewards of each.
2. Compare and contrast the various financial reporting tools and metrics and their role in informing the decision-making process.
3. Utilize available financial reporting tools and metrics to practice the basics of capital budgeting decision-making.

MGT515 - Managerial Business Foundations

1. Exhibit familiarity with the functional areas of business.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of the relationship between management and leadership.
3. Analyze the principles and role of marketing in business.
4. Assess the importance of ethics in business and why ethical responsibilities extend beyond legal and financial compliance
5. Demonstrate understanding as to why policy decisions impact the strategic direction of an organization
6. Investigate the elements of global business strategies.

MGT516 - Fundamentals of Quantitative Business Methods

1. Establish an understanding of the various functions that exist within the quantitative business environment.
2. Explore and demonstrate comprehension of both financial and managerial accounting concepts and their impact on business decisions.
3. Investigate the role economics plays in the business world.
4. Understand how operations management influences decision making.
5. Evaluate the use of information systems to improve business processes, decision-making, and knowledge distribution.
6. Distinguish descriptive, correlational, and predictive statistics as applied to a business scenario.

MGT522 - Management of Human Resources

1. Analyze the role of the Human Resources function in organizations
2. Evaluate and design key HR functions and processes
3. Compare and defend a point of view on several controversial HR issues
4. Interview a HR professional to learn more about the application of an identified HR function within an organization

MGT623 - Legal and Ethical Issues in Management

1. To develop the student's ability to analyze cases from a legal, as well as an ethical standpoint, utilizing relevant law and ethical theories.
2. To examine various ethical theories.
3. To understand how the legal process works.
4. To examine the different sources of law.
5. To give students practice making the kind of tough decision they will confront as managers.

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MGT630 - Innovative Decision Making

1. Examine and apply the various aspects of decision making in business organizations.
2. Assess and prioritize processes that surround and shape managerial decision making.
3. Analyze information processing, attention allocation and preference processing in business decision and strategy creation.
4. Research and demonstrate a power-based model of decision making.

1. Develop insights into the principles of marketing.
2. Understand applications of marketing methods and their uses

JUS510 - Contemporary Criminal Justice Issues and Trends

1. Employ research literacy and critical thinking skills to evaluate discipline-specific knowledge.
2. Analyze and critique current reports, research, and discussions in the literature and relate them to contemporary criminal justice practice.
3. Debate contemporary issues that confront criminal justice practitioners/leaders within the criminal justice field today.
4. Apply problem-solving skills to contemporary issues, ethical dilemmas, and critical questions in criminal justice.
5. Identify new developments in the law and the legal process and consider how they impact crime victims, criminal justice agencies, citizens, and practitioners.

JUS525 - Legal and Ethical Issues in Criminal Justice

1. Understand concepts, principles, and philosophies related to legal and ethical issues within the criminal justice system.
2. Amalgamate legal and ethical models and understand how they affect criminal justice professionals
3. Recognize the evolution of ethics and legal issues among criminal justice professionals and civil liability.
4. Explain complex relationships with ethical and moral codes among criminal justice professionals and the criminal justice system.
5. Identify ethical and legal models utilized in resolving concrete problems within criminal justice agencies.
6. Review and evaluate ethical and legal issues within the workplace.

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MASTERS OF EDUCATION (M.ED.):

EDU514 - Professional Writing

1. Identify and use effective techniques for writing informative
2. Prepare and administrative proposal based on synthesizing information related to the area of study.
3. Identify and use appropriate methods for professional presentations.

EDU532 - Diversity in Education

1. Define and conceptualize diversity issues in various
2. Explain cultural theory and apply cultural concepts to the educational institution.

MASTERS OF HUMANITIES (MH):

CMA515 - Teaching in the Humanities

1. Understand the nature of rhetoric and composition in a college freshman first-year writing classroom.
2. Identify major trends in research for a chosen issue within teaching rhetoric and composition.
3. Analyze their own assumptions about important writing criteria.
4. Critique and evaluate sample student papers using a given rubric.
5. Reflect on their own ideas about teaching by writing a teaching philosophy.

ENG505 - Graduate Rhetoric and Composition

1. Write at a sophisticated level appropriate to graduate school.
2. Engage other scholars as peers while building on and challenging intellectual ideas.
3. Analyze various rhetoric situations.
4. Differentiate between new contributions to a field of study and rehashing established research.

ENG525 - Research Methods

1. Find and evaluate appropriate graduate-level secondary sources.
2. Integrate secondary sources into academic writing effectively.
3. Compile and synthesize important research appropriate to chosen topic.
4. Assess the work of others as part of the peer review process.

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ENG526 - Critical Thinking

1. Use reading techniques to appropriately summarize a professional journal article.
2. Analyze and evaluate a journal article's argument for effectiveness.
3. Analyze texts from different perspectives by questioning main point and arguments.
4. Create original arguments by synthesizing material.
